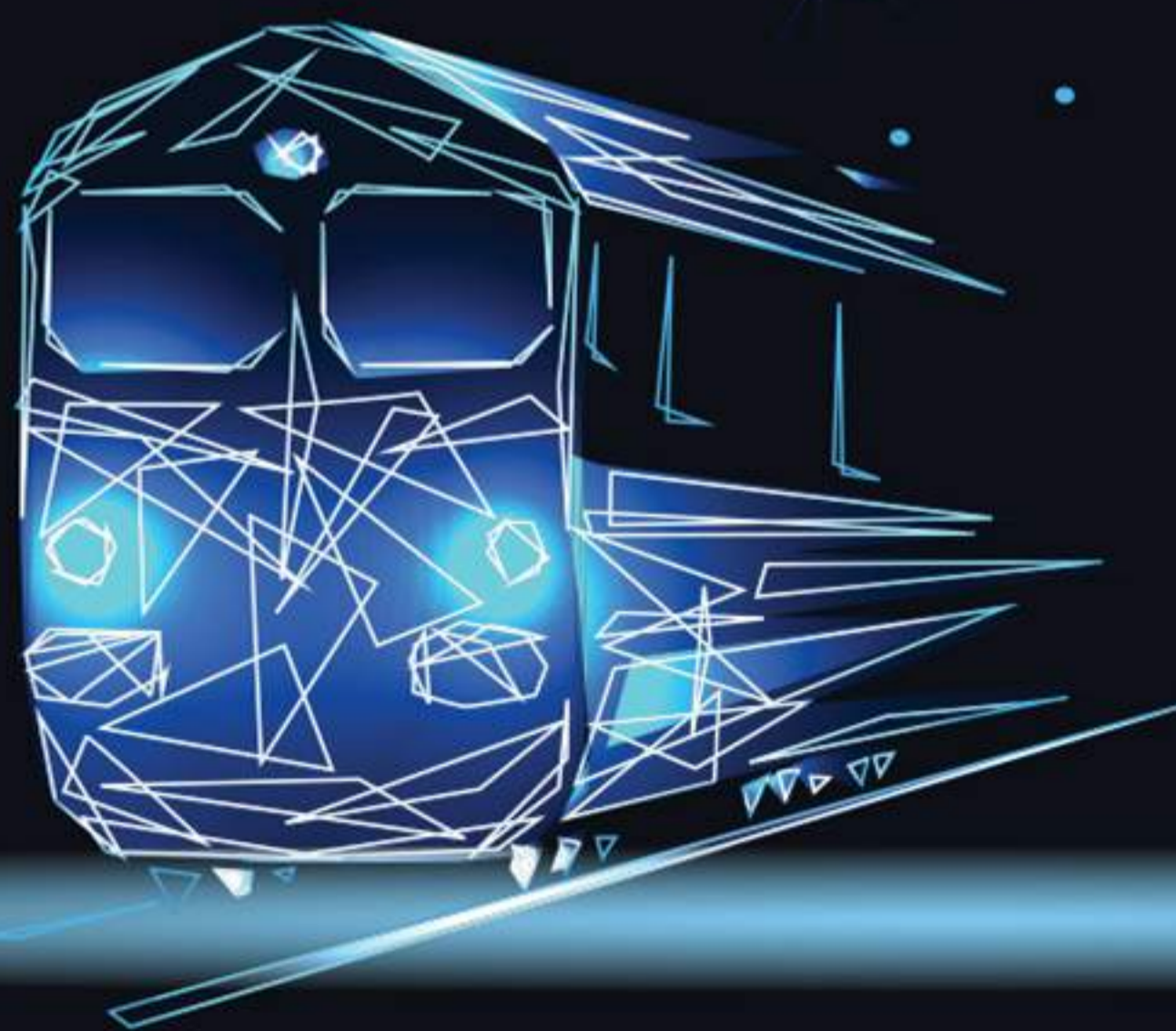

JIMMY DEAN

First team manager Jimmy Dean writes his latest set of notes...



Good afternoon and welcome back to the Attis Arena for today's encounter against Hereford.

Easter weekend saw us pick four points from a possible six games, and we feel that could have been all six in hindsight. We controlled the King's Lynn game, had the majority of the chances, restricted them to very little, but were unable to get the goal, despite hitting the woodwork on three occasions.

It wasn't a vintage performance on Easter Monday at Southport, and we were made to wait until late on for the win, but it was fantastic to see Max get the goal and win us the points a minute from time.

When you look across the last six games, we've conceded just one goal - which was a mistake at Spennymoor - keeping five clean sheets in the process. We've restricted teams to very few chances, including no shots on target for a couple of games. We have been very solid, hard to break down and hard to beat, and it means that when we do take that chance at the other end, we are in a great position to win the game.

Hereford will not be an easy task this afternoon. We enjoyed a comprehensive win in the reverse fixture, but we know what threats they possess, and will have to be on our game to get the points this afternoon. They had an extra rearranged game put in on Wednesday night at Banbury, and they edged out of that game with nine players remaining on the pitch by the end of the game. Both will be available to face us this afternoon, as their suspensions do not kick in straight away,

and they battled hard with two fewer players to take the win.

After a very busy four games in nine days, we've been able to get the rest and recovery into the squad this week, with our final three games going from weekend to weekend. We have two very important encounters here at the Attis Arena, and go to Gloucester City on the final day, and we want to create that momentum going into the play-offs. Fundamentally, we want to try and finish second, and to do that we will need to win all of our games and hope that Chorley drop some points in their final four games. To be able to get the home tie will be a massive advantage, thanks to your tremendous support, and we are confident against any opponent, especially when we are playing here.

Will Evans serves the final of a four-game suspension following his red card last month. The defence has been immense in his absence, and we are looking forward to welcoming him back

into contention for next weekend. We have also welcomed back a couple of players from the treatment room back into the squad, which can only be a good thing as we move towards the play-offs.

A big thank you again for your continued support. Your backing here at the Attis Arena has been phenomenal. On Good Friday, we had just under 4,300 supporters here which was fantastic. I've said it time and time again this season, to get that support at a Step Two game is superb, and we continue to work really hard to try and make this a successful end to the season. The players, the staff and I will be doing everything we can between now and the end of the season to try and get to where we want to be.

Up the Iron!

FOCUS ON... LIAM McALINDEN

We take the opportunity to talk to Liam McAlinden, who has returned to contention in the last couple of games after serving a three-match ban...



Having hit the ground running in claret and blue since his arrival, Liam McAlinden has had to work hard to return to the side following a red card sustained in the game against Chester last month.

Reflecting on his start to life at the Iron, he began: "It started well, results were up and down, and then obviously I got the goal and red card. Hopefully now, being back involved, I can kick on. It's football. There was the high of scoring, which was great, and then obviously the rash moment. At the time, I didn't think there was much in it, but seeing it back, there aren't many arguments with it. I had to get my head round it, and it became a bit more prolonged with the games being called off in between. Instead of it being a week to 10 days, it ended up being three weeks. I'm just glad to be back involved, and ready to go again.

"I came in with a bit of experience to come and help out, and I've got myself sent off, so on a personal note, I wasn't too pleased. I've worked hard over the three weeks to be ready, and I got back involved last weekend, so hopefully I can start another good run again."

In his three games on the sidelines, the Iron have been able to welcome back Callum Roberts from injury, as well as adding Flynn Clarke and Kai Corbett, all capable of playing in similar positions to the former Wrexham man.

"There have been a few faces, the lads have had three good results and kicked on in the games I wasn't involved in. You're never entitled to just come back in and play. I've had to work hard, keep my head down, and I was part of another big result, so hopefully I can kick on again."

No more so than the 89th winner on Easter Monday, the Iron have bounced back and continued a solid base in recent weeks, as the side look to cement a second-place finish.

“It was a massive result. The momentum now, we just want to take into the play-offs. We want to be going into them in the best form that we can. It’s a bit of a cliché, but the team in second are normally the team not in that form, it’s usually the sixth and seventh that come into it flying.

“We’ve got three good weeks of Saturday-Saturday games where we can get some solid work in on the training ground, and put everything into those three games going into the play-offs.”

Coming out of a busy Easter schedule, United were forced to add a rearranged fixture in the mix and thus played a quartet of games in a little over a week. Now, with just three league games left, it’s just weekend football from here on in.

“It wasn’t ideal to have four games in nine days, but there are no excuses because everyone has to do it. We’ve played football for a long time now, and know these schedules come up. It’s hardwearing on the body, but we’re weathered and trained to do it. Wins bring points, but going into the knockout football, it’s important to have that winning mentality. Especially in the home games, we want to be going out there and expressing ourselves. The whole season will ride on two or three games, so it’s important that we put the best version of ourselves out there.”

Those trio of games are just as important according to the 30-year-old, and while at the time of writing, the destiny to finish in second is outside of the Iron’s direct control, the pull to get the home advantage is a clear incentive to finish the regular league programme in the best possible fashion.



“At this level, everyone can beat everyone. We want to be here in the play-offs for the fans, and for the advantage. We want to be here for that 12th man. We have to get ourselves right more than anything else. There’ll be expectation on us to get the job done. These next two home games are just as big to get us prepared.”

Having been involved in the play-offs on a number of occasions, the latest participation will see McAlinden bring experience to the side.

“I’ve been involved in five sets of play-offs, good and bad. I’ve won

at Wembley in the play-off final, I've lost a couple in the semi-finals, and lost in the final twice, so I have broad knowledge of the play-offs and how cruel they can be, but also when you do win, it's one of the best ways to go up.

"The majority of the time, they are a bit of an anomaly, you're going off things involved in the game. They're one-off games. We want to take form into it, but sometimes it can be what happens on the day. We have to make sure we don't get caught up in the big moments, but there is a lot of experience in our side to be able to deal with that. Me being able to add that bit of experience of being through it is great."

He next looked back on his time at Wrexham, and why the Iron was the next

move for him: "I enjoyed my time there really, but everything comes to an end. You know when your time is up. I got to a point at 30 where I had a decision to make about going to play some football. I've got a little boy who is three and loves coming to the games. I want to be out there on the pitch and him seeing me play week-in, week-out rather than being part of a good group.

"I got involved at the right time really, right at the start. I was the new manager's first signing coming in. I've been through all of the best bits the team has had in recently history so I couldn't say a bad word about anyone involved in the club.

"When you've been through something like that, you have to weigh up the next options. A club like this, at the level, it shouldn't be. I looked at what I wanted to achieve coming here, and hoping I can come in and help the lads achieve the goals after doing so well so far. You're always prepping for the future as well, and if it works out and I stay, you can see the club will hold it's

own if we do get promoted."

Having been at a number of clubs across the EFL, McAlinden has often been on the opposing team line-up, and his memories of being at the Attis Arena also contributed to his decision to switch to the home dressing room.

"There have been a few. It's one of those where I've managed to be at the same level through my career, coming here a couple of times at Fleetwood and Shrewsbury in League One times. I came here in the Morecambe year and two years at Wrexham.

"Early doors, when I first came through at Wolves was in the Championship era. Throughout my career, I've come up against the club quite a lot. The club has proved in the past where it can be and you can see the owners coming in and how much it means to them.

"To hopefully be part of that would be fantastic."

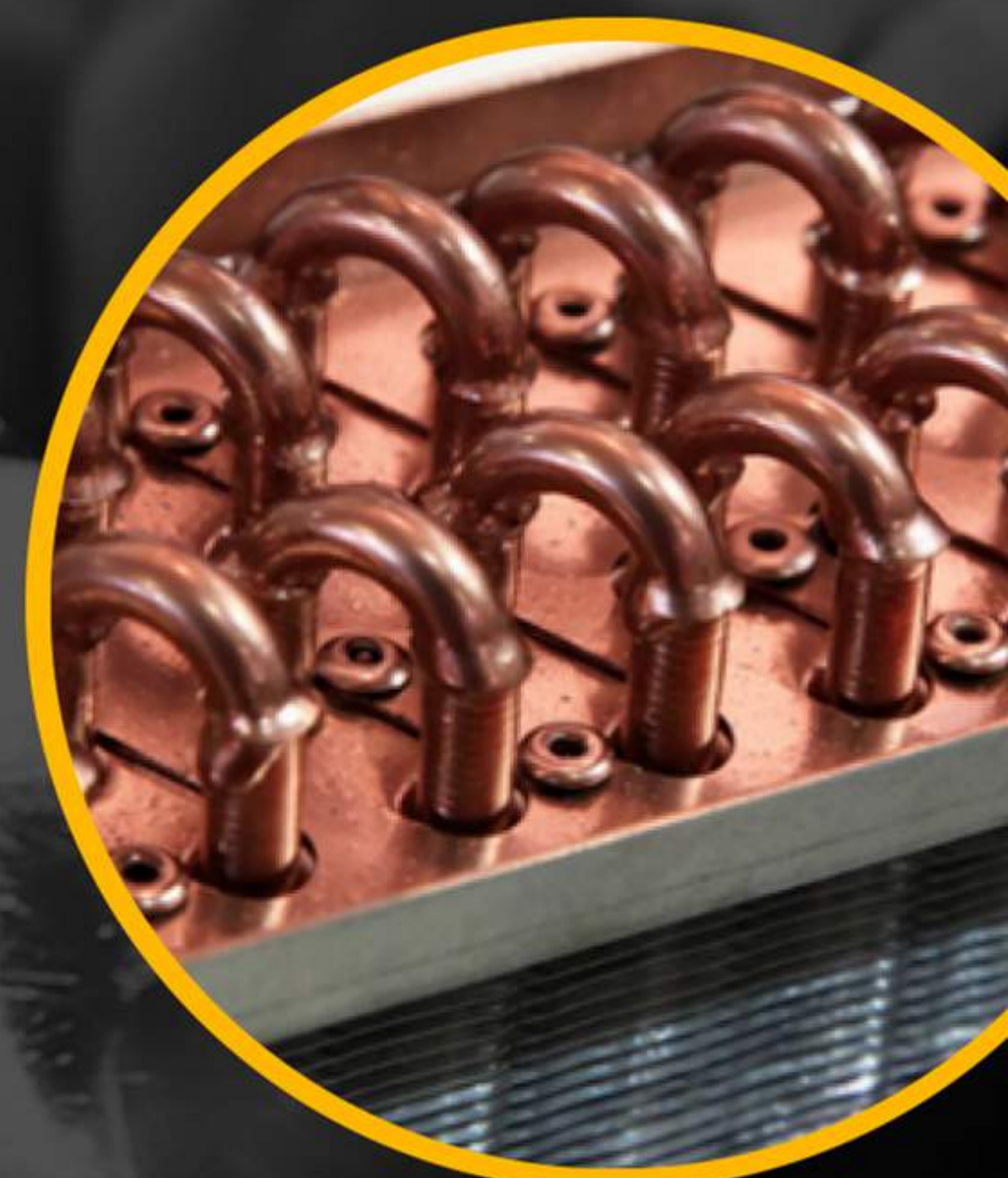

Historian John Staff continues his 100-year rewind, looking back at 1923-24

A century ago April had arrived, and in the emerging steel town at Scunthorpe, the chill in the air was turning to a most pleasant feel, especially when the sun took his hat off, on an increasing number of occasions.

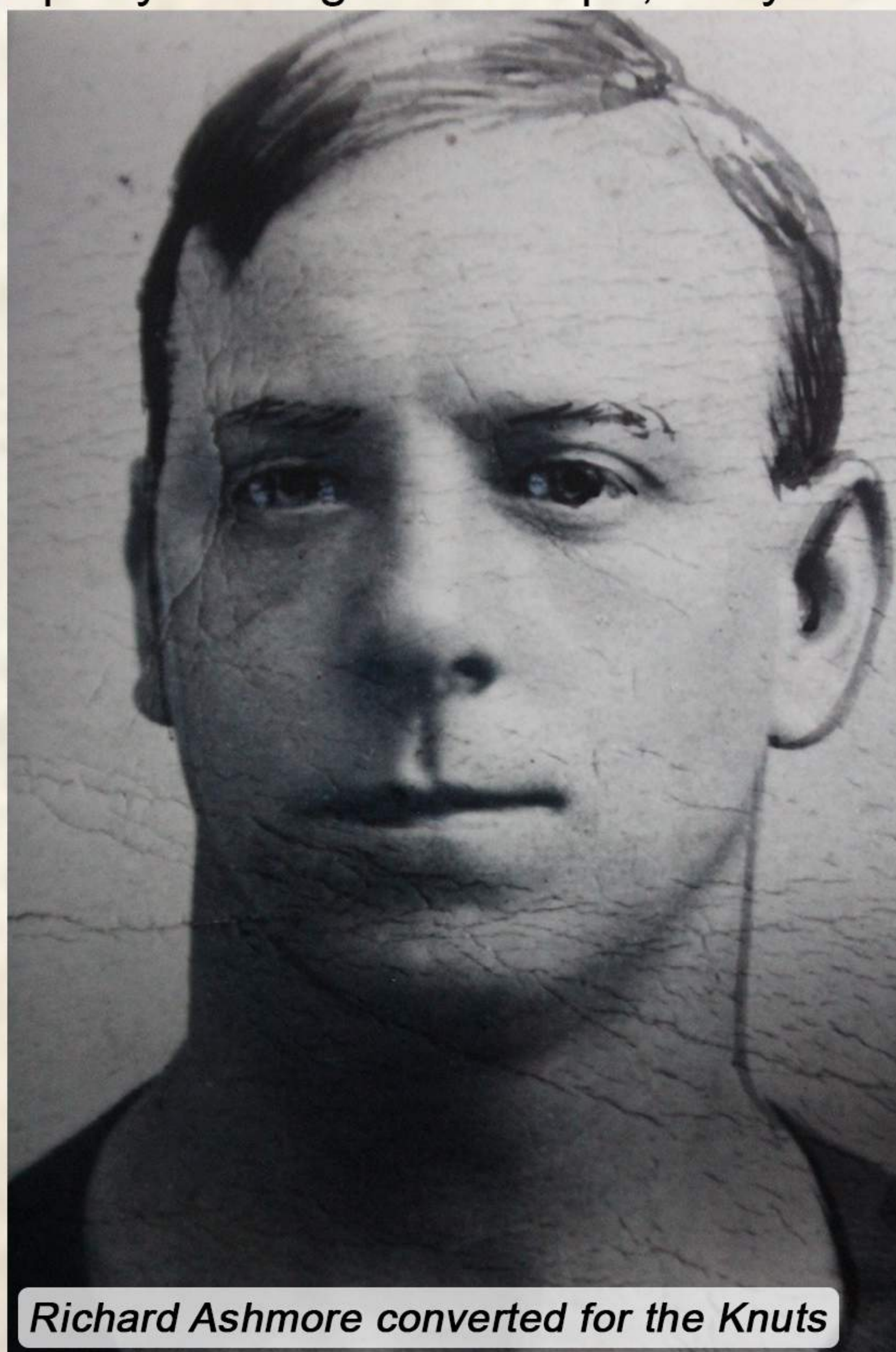
When the weather looked to be dry, Scunthorpe United's secretary, Harry Allcock dispensed with his gabardine rain coat, in favour of just his grey suit, waistcoat, with an albert attached to his time piece. Usually, he cycled everywhere on his black Raleigh bicycle, from his home on Theodore Road, the half mile or so to the Old Show Ground, although sometimes he had to attend United's offices at an address on Scunthorpe High Street.

Harry Allcock was a well-known character in the town, not only for his daytime occupation of looking after the affairs of Scunthorpe United, but also as a regular visitor to the Centenary Methodists Church, on the corner of Smith Street and Frodingham Road. However, it was his work at the football club which was the never ending story, as Scunthorpe United strove to win their first Midland League trophy, and this last season had seen steps in the right direction, but it would not end in glory for 1923-24.

What made the job of short this stocky man interesting was that he had a first team and reserves to attend to, and he only had a Sunday at home with his family. During March and into April, the first team had to play twice a week, and on one occasion it was three times, and Harry was in attendance, at home and away. Towards the beginning of March, some favourable results saw Scunthorpe United in the higher reaches of the Midland League,

but shocking injuries had curtailed all realistic chances of top place, including the loss of Captain Oscar Hargreaves with a triple break to a leg.

On March 29th, 1924, Scunthorpe had finished the month with a sound beating of Boston United at the Old Show Ground. It was a pay-back for the Nuts having lost by a single goal at York Street, Boston, seven days before. Then came a visit into Nottinghamshire, for the Club's first visit to Sutton, and the home side were no April fools. Scunthorpe shot themselves in the foot, giving away a penalty in each half, and a 3-1 victory by the Sutton lads was justice. The Scunthorpe disorganisation was summed up, when Norman Reynolds missed the Scunthorpe party leaving Scunthorpe, early in

the morning, but caught a train, and was picked up at Worksop railway station. By all accounts, it was his presence with the gloves that kept the scoring down.

Harry Allcock next had to make arrangement for a Wednesday evening in Castleford. The education of this match was given in the briefest of reports in the 'Star' newspaper, which only mentioned the result, and goal scorers. However, the 'Saturday Telegraph Football edition' said a little more from its 'Nutty Bits' column. This concluded that the visit to Castleford had finished as a 1-1 draw, but Scunthorpe should have won, because overall they were the better side, and Castleford had a poor Midland League record. A draw should not have been unexpected, because this was the fourth consecutive visit the Nuts had made to this venue, where the struggle had finished tied. Richard Ashmore, United's centre half, scored the first goal, but there was an element of fortune about the Castleford equaliser by Dickinson. Apparently, it was 'a chance shot, which should have been saved', but they all count, and the Nuts who have been grateful if a winner had come their way, in a similar fashion.

On the following Saturday, April 12th, 1924, Scunthorpe United

THREE GOALS' DEFEAT. NUTS' UNLUCKY DAY AT WATH.

Scunthorpe United were at full strength to-day when they visited Wath Athletic, whilst the home team relied upon the same eleven which won at Denaby last week by two clear goals. The ground was on the soft side and the sunshine was broken by periodical showers. The Wath ground by the way is one of the best in the League, although it was here that the United were beaten by four goals last season. Teams:

The slump at Wath Beverley and Wheatley; Baker, Nicholson and Lennis;

shot which was very wide of the mark. A little later Skull just failed to keep the ball in play when he tried to centre. In the first 20 minutes play there has not been a good shot at goal.

SMART CLEARANCE.

Ashmore brought off a smart clearance when Wroe got away again. Play was confined to the centre of the field for a time. There was a tendency for both sets of backs to overkick. A good movement by the United forwards was promising until Foster got offside. Brayshaw endeavoured to work an open-

goalkeeper. On the other hand, Wath were sharp, and at half-time were two goals to the good. The second period was the same procession, and a further score gave the Yorkshiremen a 3-0 result to bank into their League table. Scunthorpe toiled throughout, but were second best. The only credit was a slap on the back for Richard Ashmore, again. He worked overtime at the heart of the defence, but tired towards the final phase of the match.

The past four games had seen Scunthorpe United slip back in terms of their climb up the table, and only one point had been taken from the last eight on offer.

On the horizon, only five matches remained on the fixture card, and the next episode was at home, against Mansfield Town, who were so far ahead of the field, that they were already declared the Champions for the 1923-24 season.

travelled to Wath Athletic, which was said to have one of the best surfaces in the Midland League. In this case, it was soft on top, and on the afternoon, sunshine was interrupted by occasional April showers. The team at Castleford was not published, but at Wath it was said to be at 'full strength', and represented by the following personalities: Reynolds, goalkeeper; Bradbury and Franklin, fullbacks; Skull,

Ashmore and Millson, halfbacks; Broskom, Burkinshaw, Raby, Kitchen and Foster.

Sadly for supporters of the Natty Nuts, the colonel was crushed on this occasion, despite a plucky performance. Wath Athletic had eleven players who were able to match and excel everything that the Scunthorpe team had to offer. In this contest, the visiting forwards were weak in front of goal, and could not trouble the Wath

We take a look at this afternoon's opponents, first starting with their brief history of how they got to where they are today...



A BRIEF HISTORY

Born out of the ashes of Hereford United, Hereford FC were placed in the Midland Football League for the 2015-16 season after the former club folded in December 2014.

Hereford United famed for the 1972 FA Cup victory over Newcastle United and that Ronnie Radford goal had been blighted by financial issues for the final years of their existence, facing winding up petitions in the court nearly twenty times in the last 24 months.

The club's varying owners were in open disagreement with the majority of the support over the final few months, and the end came as a relief to many albeit tinged with much sadness.

Playing out of the historic Edgar Street Athletic Ground that hosted a string of Hereford clubs in the 1920s before Hereford United was formed from a merger of local sides, the new club have retained the nickname The Bulls, the white shirts, and the Herefordshire Bull on the club crest even parading the real thing at their first competitive match in August and later at Wembley for the FA Vase Final.

In the first season The Bulls started writing their own history by setting a string of Midland Football League attendance records, starting with their first game, and breaking ground attendance records at several away grounds as they took the Midland Football League double. That season also saw The Bulls win the Herefordshire FA County Challenge Cup, before finishing off with taking over 21,000 supporters to Wembley in the FA Vase Final.

The second season saw Hereford race to the Southern League South & West title, winning the league with a total of 107 points, beating second place Salisbury by 18 points. The 2016-17 season also saw The Bulls win the Herefordshire FA Challenge cup for the second season in a row, as well as beating the winners of the Southern League Central division, Royston Town in the end of season 'Champions' vs 'Champions' match.

The Bulls completed a hat-trick of promotions in the 2017-18 season, but King's Lynn and Kettering made sure it wasn't an easy ride, running The Bulls close for the title. Hereford finally secured the league with three games to spare.

The 2017-18 season also saw the Bulls enjoy their best-ever run in the FA Cup since forming in 2015. Beating AFC Telford in the 1st Round Proper, Hereford then held League 1 Fleetwood to a 1-1 draw at Highbury, before sadly losing the replay at Edgar Street, a game that was screened live on BT Sport. The Bulls were the last surviving non-league side left in the competition.

The 2019-20 season saw Hereford face their toughest season to date, playing against the likes of former Football League sides, Stockport, Kidderminster, York, Darlington and Chester in the National League North. It was a challenging season that saw Peter Beadle replaced by Tim Harris (Head of Football) and Marc Richards (Head Coach) as The Bulls reorganised their footballing structure to better prepare them for future seasons. They'd finish 17th, and build in future seasons.

A hard-working and lively front-runner who joined the Bulls for an undisclosed fee from Stourbridge in June 2023.

He was a firm favourite with the Glassboys, where he notched 29 goals in 2022-23 on his way to scooping numerous end of season awards. Having started his career with Redditch Borough, he then joined Bromsgrove Sporting where his record in front of goal brought plenty of higher-level attention and it resulted in him moving into the Football League with Stevenage in 2019.

He then joined Macclesfield Town shortly before their sad demise and then returned to Bromsgrove Sporting prior to his switch to Stourbridge in 2021. He has also had loan spells with the likes of Solihull Moors and Kidderminster Harriers. So far this campaign Cowley has been the star of the Bulls season and is the one to keep an eye on.

3. Lewis Hudson

The Coventry born defender joined the Bulls from Rushall Olympic where he has been a consistent starter in the Pic's back line. Lewis spent two seasons with Redditch United where he proved his worth and earned his move to the National League North.

6. Paul Downing

With plenty of experience, Downing joins the Bulls from Portsmouth where he spent 3 years of his career. An ex-Hereford United loanee, Paul knows what it means to play for the Bulls. A short spell in 2010 on loan from West Brom, Downing made six appearances at the back. A centre-half with an abundance of composure and experience, he will really sure up the Bulls back line. He was most well-known for his time at Walsall where he made over 150 appearances in League One over a four-year stint.

21. Ollie Southern

A versatile right-back who is also able to play in the heart of the back-line, he joined the Bulls in May 2023 from Bala Town. Having cut his footballing teeth within the youth ranks at Crewe Alexandra, he then moved on to Curzon Ashton before linking up with Bala and becoming a regular in their team.

27. Nathan Cameron

A commanding central defender who has previously been with the likes of Coventry City, Bury and Wigan Athletic, Cameron has more than 200 EFL appearances to his name, while also being an England U20 International earlier in his career. Cameron has a wealth of experience at this level having played for both Kidderminster Harriers and Telford United in recent years.

MIDFIELDERS

4. Aurio Teixeira

The highly-rated youngster was snapped up on a two-year deal in

May 2023 following an impressive season at Alvechurch, where he was a regular in the side that enjoyed an exciting FA Cup adventure. A defensive midfielder, he came through the ranks at West Bromwich Albion where he was known as a ball-winner who was calm and assured on the ball.

5. Jordan Lyden

The Australian-born midfielder started his professional career at Aston Villa making four Premier League appearances in the 2014-15 season. He had spells at Oldham and Swindon, securing his first League Two title for the Robins in 2020 before getting his hands on the trophy again last season with Leyton Orient.

7. Yusifu Ceesay

The pacey winger joins the Bulls' having previously had spells at Blackpool and Kidderminster, as well as two successful stints at Alfreton Town.

8. Alex Babos

A hard-working and confident central midfielder who joined the club in May 2023 having been a regular in the Banbury United team.

It was at Derby County where he learned his trade and progressed to secure a professional contract in 2016. He was loaned out to Spanish outfit, Real Union, as well as FC United of Manchester, while also getting regular game-time for the Rams' U23 team. The Wales U21 International then went on to serve Alfreton Town and King's Lynn Town.

FORWARDS

10. Andy Williams

Hereford born and bred, he started his career with the Bulls at Edgar Street making his mark on the Hereford side that won the play-off final against Halifax Town in 2006. After his departure from the street, Williams went on to have a fantastic career in the Football League playing for the likes of Bristol Rovers and Yeovil Town before his move to Swindon Town where he met the Bulls' new boss, Paul Caddis. Williams joined Hereford from League Two side, Walsall where he made 30 appearances last season in all competitions.

ON THE ROAD GLOUCESTER CITY



MONDAY, APRIL 1ST - 3PM

The Iron are set to finish the Vanarama National League North season with a highly anticipated, fierce encounter with relegation candidates Gloucester City. The fixture against the Tigers is to be the final away game of the season as well as being the second longest away trip (second by just one mile from today's opponents Hereford FC).

The only previous encounter between the two outfits isn't one that lives long in the memory, as the only other game ended in a dominant 2-0 victory for the Iron. On that day in November, United triumphed courtesy of a first-half Jacob Butterfield screamer from 25-yards, this was later followed by Danny Whitehall who rubber stamped the victory in the second period with a ruthless penalty kick. The Tigers have experienced a disappointing season this time out in the sixth tier as they've been unable to repeat last year's joys that saw them scrape the final play-off spot in the National league North. In the 2022-23 season, Gloucester came their closest to the fifth tier in their 141-year history following late drama in their final day 4-3 victory over Chorley.

THE STADIUM

The venue for the day is to be the TigerTurf stadium (formerly known as Meadow Park) which holds a maximum capacity of 4,000 spectators with 762 of which being seated that are all found under roof cover. The stadium itself is a relatively new facility with construction finishing in 2020, built in an obscure fashion the ground is built a top of the former home of the Tigers which was Meadow Park.

Prior to this, in 1964 Gloucester would formerly play their fixtures at the "massive" Horton Road stadium which was situated closer to the centre of the City and at one point could hold close to the 30,000 supporters. Following this The Tigers entered the "glory years" at the Meadow Park stadium which saw countless promising FA Cup runs throughout the 1980's and 90's. This period would last until 2007 when an unfortunate flood would write off the stadium and with it the memories made since 1984.

BY CAR

An astonishing 348-mile round trip from the Attis Arena, the TigerTurf stadium is situated on

the outskirts of Gloucester and is an estimated three hour drive when travelling by car.

- > Take Doncaster Rd/A18 to A1077(M)
- > Follow M180, M18 and M1 to A42 in Leicestershire. Take the A42 exit from M1
- > Continue onto A42
- > Follow M42 and M5 to A40 in Gloucestershire. Take exit 11 from M5
- > Continue on A40. Drive to Sudmeadow Rd in Gloucester where you will find the TigerTurf stadium.

ALTERNATIVE TRAVEL

Firstly, coach travel from the Attis Arena is available with spaces on the coach filling up fans are recommended to book.

Otherwise there is train travel available with the Evesham Railway Station being located merely 2 miles from the stadium.

CAR PARKING

Once arriving at the stadium there is a free car park on site that has been described by Football Ground Guide as a fairly sized facility, however there is also limited street parking in the surrounding areas.

The Iron will be back at the Attis Arena on Saturday, April 13th, for the final home game of the regular season.

The reverse fixture between the two sides was a rearranged fixture back in early February when Scunthorpe travelled to the north-east. In this encounter United's perfect away performance was stolen in the dying embers as Blyth equalised with last kick of the game. Will McGowan was the player with the goal, cancelling out Danny Elliott's opener, with a goal from Kian Scales in the first half controversially chalked off, with the Iron also denied a penalty after a dismissed foul on Cameron Wilson, who was cautioned for simulation instead.

This time round the Iron will be looking for revenge on home soil, however it is to be no easy feat with the Spartans fighting desperately for survival down the lower end of the National League North standings.

At the time of writing, they sit in 18th and are facing a difficult run into the end of the campaign with Rushall Olympic, Scunthorpe and Brackley Town still to play.
