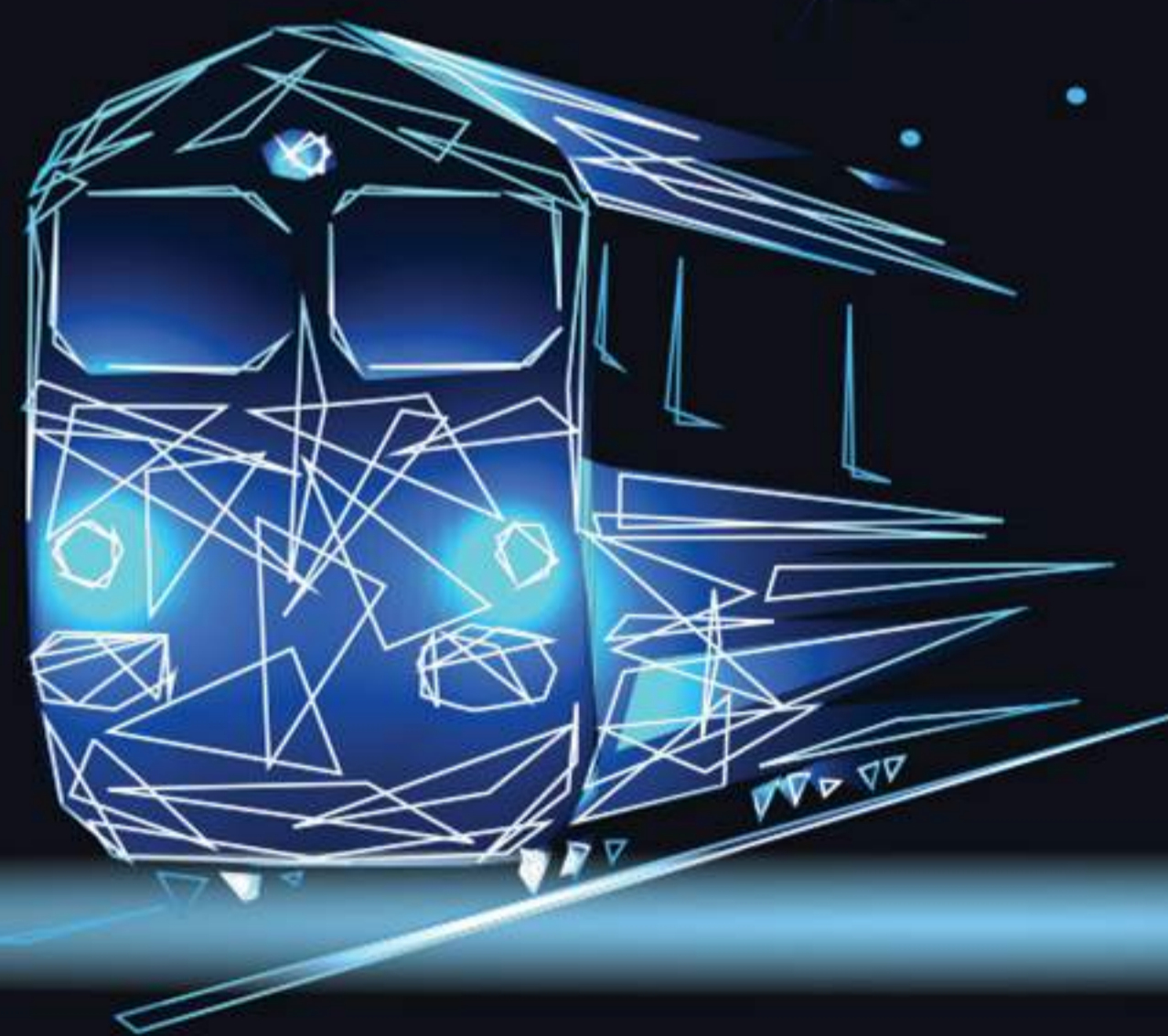

# JIMMY DEAN

First team manager Jimmy Dean writes his latest set of notes...



**Good afternoon, and welcome back to the Attis Arena for this afternoon's game against Banbury United.**

Last time we were here a fortnight ago, we had our Community Day, which was a fantastic event to be involved in and one I will remember for the rest of my life. To have 7,311 people inside the stadium, to break the record, and to be part of that was absolutely fantastic. To have that many people here for a Step 2 game is incredible, and shows what this club means to so many people. On the day, we battled back twice from goals down, and had 10 players, and we feel as though we should have won the game in the end, particularly with two big penalty shouts that were again not in our favour.

After such a high of that game, we endured one of the lowest points of the season on the Tuesday that followed at Darlington. I maintain that I do not know where that performance came from, having been so resilient and dogged against Alfreton and Chester. The performance was disgraceful, and as manager I took full responsibility for that night. We had to put it right, we came in on the Wednesday and were determined to rectify the wrongs.

We began that last weekend at Bishop's Stortford. To get a goal after 22 seconds, and be 2-0 up after five minutes, we had the perfect response to that and it showed the players wanted to make amends and put it right. It was great to have Danny Whitehall back on the scoresheet with a hat-trick, and great for Danny Elliott to come off the bench and get a goal too.

We also gave Flynn Clarke more minutes, and he scored an excellent goal from range. We know what he's capable of, and have been working him up to be ready for more minutes. If we can get him firing, he will be massive asset between now and the end of the season.

Ahead of the Spennymoor Town game, we welcomed Kai Corbett to the club on loan from Peterborough. He adds to our attacking options, and I'm sure he will bolster what we have here. He's looked sharp in training, and was going to be in the squad on Tuesday.

On Tuesday, we were once again frustrated. For the second time this season, we travelled to the north-east only for the game to be called off by the referee less than an hour before kick-off. It's frustrating for us, to prepare and travel for the game, but we know how frustrating it is for you as supporters, taking time off work and paying money to travel up. For that we can only apologise, as it's totally beyond our control. We will be ready for

when the game is rearranged, as it will be another opportunity for three points.

We welcome Banbury this afternoon, a team fighting for their lives in a tight bottom half of the division. We know how well we played in the reverse fixture in November, and will have to do the same to come out with three points.

The atmosphere here last time out was incredible, and we need that to drive us on to a result. It was that atmosphere that helped us get the equaliser against Chester, and nearly get a winner late on, and we will need that for our last four home league games this season. Each one is vital for our season, and we hope you can come and get behind us for all of them!

# FOCUS ON... FLYNN CLARKE

We delve deeper into one of the Iron's latest recruits Flynn Clarke, as he reflects on his goal last week and a potential home debut...



**With a definite focus to get his career back on track, attacking midfielder Flynn Clarke is thankful that the Iron are giving him that opportunity, weeks into a loan spell from Norwich City.**

The 21-year-old hit the net in last week's 5-0 demolition of basement side of Bishop's Stortford, and is aiming to use that as a catalyst for further success in claret and blue.

"Words can't describe how that felt. It's been a very long time. The moment I've seen it hit the back of the net, I've had all types of emotions going through my head. I didn't really know what to do. I think I celebrated about four or five times. It was amazing, not just for me, but for my family as well. They've supported me this whole time, and for them to finally see me doing something that they've watched me do since growing up, is a good feeling."

"I've missed the feeling, and words cannot describe it. Everyone wants to score goals as we as defenders want to keep clean sheets. I just want to score goals, and the fact that it's been a long time, hopefully I can have that feeling more now I've got off the mark."

"I've found it really good so far. The boys have let me into the group very well, and the staff as well. I've really enjoyed it here, it's a good set-up. The fans have been amazing ever since I walked in, regardless of a few bad results, they've stuck by us."

Clarke was training with the Iron weeks before signing - with the club looking to lift an embargo, with the former Posh youngster the first acquisition under the current ownership. He was even forced to be patient after signing, as he looked to get back up to speed.

"I knew it would take some time, and I still think I need some time to get where I'm at. I need more minutes for that. Match fitness is completely different. Fitness-wise I've always been good at running, but match fitness is a different

scenario. My last 90 minutes was the Cleethorpes game, but before that it was maybe a season and a half. My target for this season is to just get as many minutes as I possibly can, and then I'll probably know where I'll be in a couple of games, but I'm not there yet.

"I want to play every game, and as many minutes, until the end of the season, but on a personal note, I knew I wasn't ready. I didn't want to get thrown into the deep end, as much as I did want that, and I wanted to play. I knew myself I wasn't there just yet, and I knew it would take a little bit of time to get used to things again, and get used to the new players, the staff and the processes."

With strong pedigree, Clarke spent much of his youth years at Peterborough United before Norwich City paid a reported seven-figure sum for his services. Speaking about his younger days, and the switch, he continued: "I was just a kid at the time. I was 17 and a bit naive to how it all worked. I'd been at Peterborough for most of my life, for nine years, and I wasn't used to what usually happens. I left what happened to the side and focused on myself, focused on playing football with a smile on my face. Ultimately, that's what I want to do. I was just focusing on training every day, playing as many minutes as I could, get goals and assists, and when that all came about, I just let it happen."

"I was growing up through the ranks at Peterborough, so when I went into the first team, I was only in-and-around it. I had an injury too. When I moved to Norwich, I was floating between the academy and the first team facilities. It was a wow moment. I wasn't used to that. Peterborough was good, and each year it got better through upgrades, but Norwich's was out of this world. They've got everything you need."

Prior to Clarke's imprisonment following a charge of dangerous driving in April 2022, he had continued to make a favourable impression with his new club.



I think I was doing alright. I went to Norwich on the back end of an injury, so within in a month I was back in it. It probably took me a couple of months to get to where I needed to be. I finished the back end of the first season on a really positive note, scoring 14 goals."

That's where the then-20-year-old's high prospects and immediate future in the game came crashing down. Clarke spent the first month of the current campaign on loan at Dagenham and Redbridge, knowing a sentencing was looming for the incident that took place 17 months prior.

"I can't change what happened. It's definitely matured me as a person, and made me not take things for granted. It's made me work a lot harder, take a step back from everything in terms of my footballing life and personal life, it forced me to take a step back from it all. From now on, I want to make sure that, no matter what I'm doing, I'm doing it to the best of my ability. I'm making sure that I do everything right every day, because you never know what's round the corner for yourself."

"I definitely had to grow up quicker. With what came my way, I had to do that. I was dealing with a lot things away from football. It was very stressful for me, and I had to learn to communicate with my family and other people as they tried to help me. I found it quite difficult, because I'm a person that likes to deal with things on my own. I had to learn to get help, because

it's alright to get help sometimes. Everything that happened made me grow up in all different ways of life.

"Everyone is going to have an opinion, no matter what you do in life. People wait for you to slip up - even if you've done nothing wrong, some try and find something. What was important for me was that support network I had - my family, my girlfriend's family, my friends, and even the club staff - even here as well.

"I had to block a lot out - all the messages I

was getting, and other things. I have to try to move forward. I have had the chance to speak to the people involved pretty much straight afterwards, in both vehicles involved."

The Iron have a past history of signing players looking to move on from a past mistake. A chance for second chances, and Flynn is certainly repentful and is looking to take the opportunity.

"What I've noticed here are the people of Scunthorpe United, including the fans, have been very supportive of me. I've received loads of messages, and they've been nothing but very nice and positive. I feel like they understand it. What's happened has happened, and I've got to move on and get my career back on track. Even the staff and the players understand that. I can't change what's happened, I can only change what's in front of me now.

"What Norwich have done for me while I was inside and up until now, I'm really thankful for. I don't think there's anything I can do can repay them back. They quite easily could have cut ends with me, and they didn't.

"I feel like it's a reset button now for me. I need to try and get as many games as I can, get my career back on track, and I need to mentally get back on track, as well as physically. I don't need to find my love for the game again, because I never lost it, but I need to grasp that again, as it's all I want to be doing. I need to work hard to make sure this is what I'm doing in the future.

"It was very difficult to not have that. All I've ever known is play football, play football and play football. When you have a change of schedule in your life, and you're limited to doing things, it's very difficult. I had to work on myself mentally, and to stay fit and healthy. I read quite a lot of football books to try to keep

my brain football-focused."

Out of contract with the Canaries in the summer, Clarke spoke on his future at Carrow Road, and potential future at the Attis Arena: "In my heart, I like it here. At the moment, I would like to stay here again and build those relations, with the staff and the fans. I want to play games and build my reputation up again as a Scunthorpe United player. It's easy to say that, but we don't know what's going to happen or where we will be at the end of the season. I have to focus on what's ahead of me, but not get too far forward. I have no idea what my future is at Norwich. I know my contract is up at the end of the season, and I'm not too sure what's going to happen.

"Scunthorpe United have helped me out massively when probably no one else wanted to do that, and I'm very grateful for that. Again, I don't think anything I can do will repay that back, but that's why I would like to stay here for another year to try and do that. It's an important few weeks until the end of the season."

Given the opportunity to stay in claret and blue, he knows it will be a big pre-season to get back to the levels he's previously known for himself. His final thoughts alluded to a potential home debut today.

"It'd be massive. People underestimate pre-season. It's doom and glory. Everyone hates it, but it's so good for you at the same time. There's a lot of running involved, but a full pre-season would do me amazing. It's something I've missed out on, and it's something I definitely need.

"I can't wait, and fingers crossed I make my home debut this weekend. Hopefully we can get three points, hopefully I can get on the scoresheet again. I'm looking forward to it. We want to make sure we do the fans proud."

## KAI CORBETT ADDED TO IRON RANKS

Scunthorpe United is delighted to welcome Peterborough United forward Kai Corbett to the club on loan until the end of the season.

Born in Spain, he began his youth career at Barcelona before joining Arsenal's Under-9s after stints at Chelsea and Southampton, after his family moved back to England. After adding Southampton, Arsenal and Reading to the sides he trialed with, he eventually settled on West Ham United, where he signed in 2014.

Corbett featured regularly for Hammers' Under-18 and Under-23 side, especially over his final year at the club, while he also had a trial at Manchester United in 2020. He scored in a 1-0 win at Under-18 level, and significantly interested the Red Devils, but he was subsequently unable to sign for them due to a dispute with his compensation fee.

Despite the Hammers offering him a new deal in 2021, the 21-year-old opted to end a seven-year association with the side, and moved to Peterborough United.

Capable of playing as a striker, on the channel, or in the number 10 and eight roles, he is highly-rated by Peterborough, and has made three appearances for their first team this season, including a start in the Carabao Cup, and two substitute appearances in the Bristol Street Motors Trophy.

The nature of the switch to the Iron holds a recall after 28 days of the initial period, should the Posh wish to activate it.

Kai's switch to Scunthorpe came in time for Tuesday night before postponement.

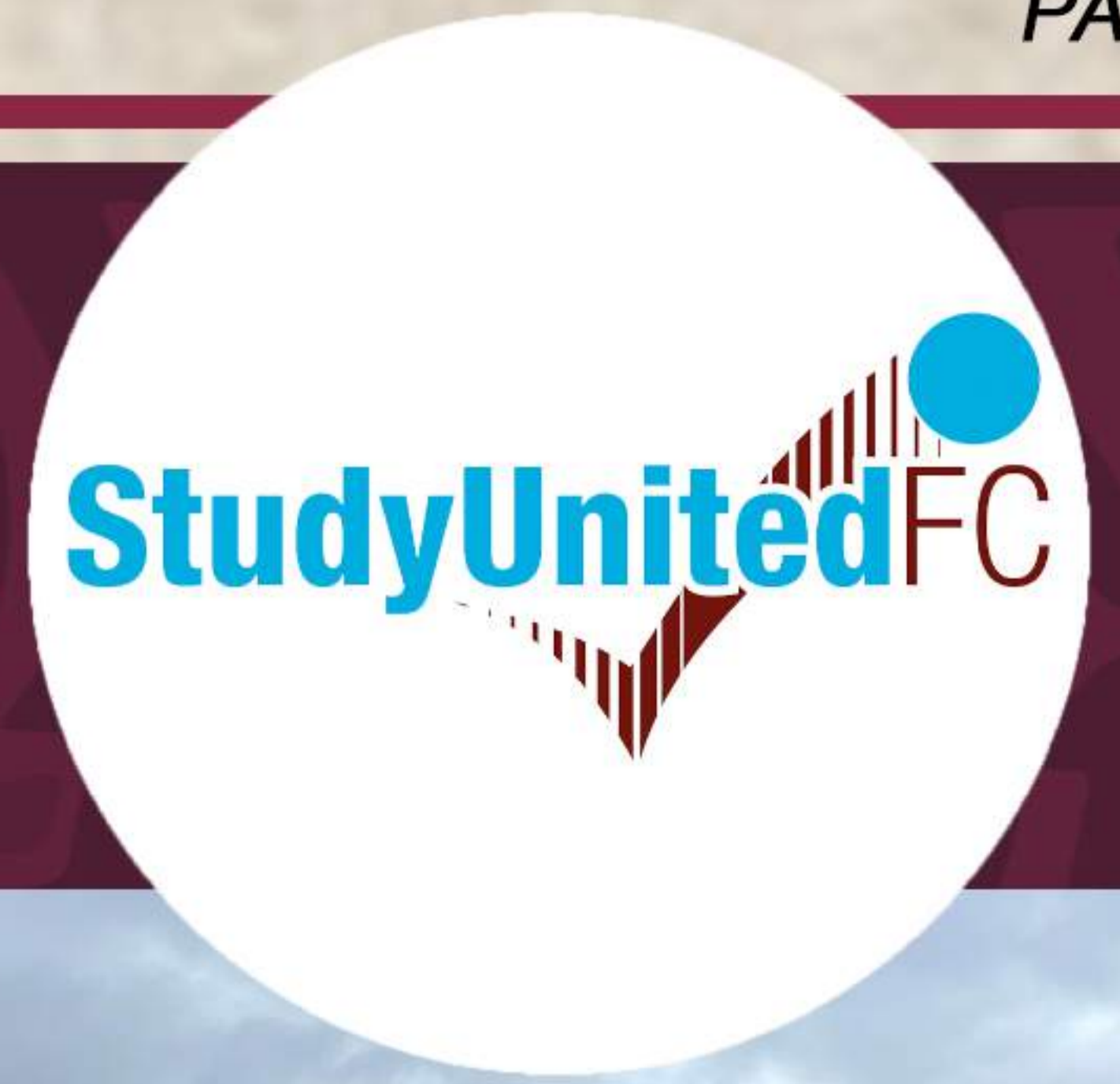

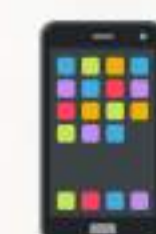

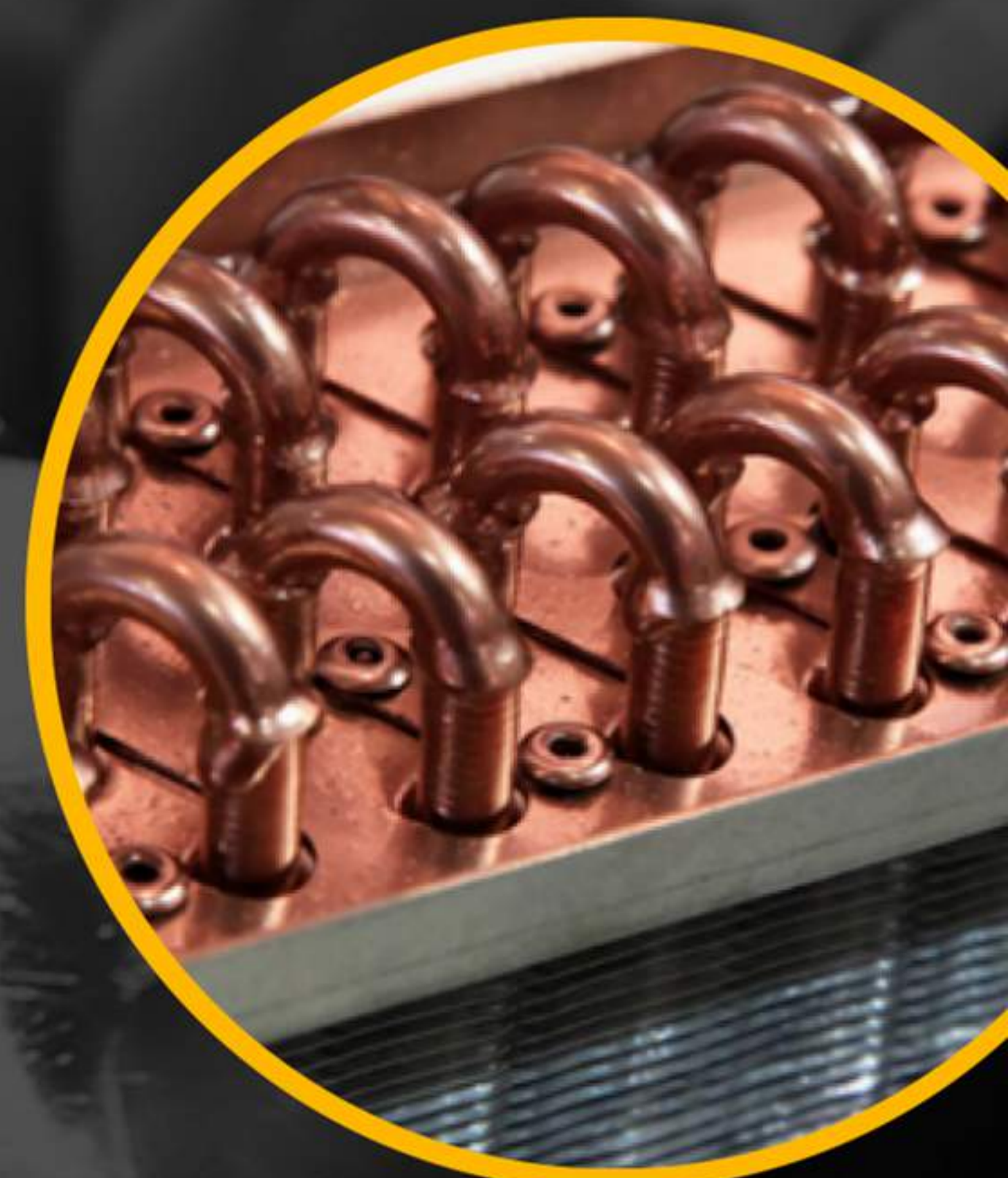

### TWO FOR THE ROAD

Historian John Staff continues his 100-year rewind, looking back at 1923-24

There was a suggestion, a century ago, that spring was on its way. The slight hint being that the frosts on the ground were less severe, and cleared up quicker than they did a month ago.

In the sun, when it did make a fleeting appearance, it was pleasant on the face. After all, the daylight was staying longer, and when the next match was scheduled on March 22nd 1924, officially the new season was supposed to have arrived. When watching a football match at the Old Show Ground, then, still had a requirement to wrap up, and only the foolhardy ventured without the garments to keep warm for nearly two hour, in the fresh air. Harry Allcock, United's hardworking secretary, was a prime example, and was always suitably clad in gabardine and trilby.

Harry Allcock was usually present at each and every first team fixture that the Nuts were expected to fulfil, with all players registered and suspension free. Then the officials had to be catered for at home fixtures, after which every penny of gate money required bagging on Saturday, ready for banking on Monday. He was a well-known figure at all Midland League grounds, having communicated with the opposition over almost ten years, to make sure all arrangements were up to speed. The pace of 1924 was not of the mobile phone, but of a letter and postman or the very occasional phone call. Of course, this was repeated with the reserve team.

ne hundred years age, the previous eight days had been a busy, with three League matches on the bounce. First, on the Saturday, the senior squad visited Rotherham to play the County

Reserves, and a hard fought game yielded a point from a 1-1 draw. The game may not have been an epic, but an away point on the board is never a gift to be spurned. Next, within the short space of five days, the County Reserves returned the favour, with the corresponding fixture at Scunthorpe. There was never a crush at the turnstiles to see this one, but those who did pay the 'kings shilling' were pleased with a 1-0 victory. All be it from the unlikely source of the boot of Bradbury, a player who thought the opposition's half was a foreign country.

With no time to relax, two days later the Nuts entertained Wombwell, a gritty Yorkshire side. Only a poor attendance watched a dour game, with any honours

going to the defence. In this encounter there was a welcome appearing of John Wogin for only the second time this season, in place of unavailable regular custodian, Norman Reynolds. In the first half, the home forwards were so poor that at half time they were reshuffled, and when Broskom hit the cross bar, Raby netted the rebound. The second 1-0 result in two days meant five points out of six, despite the lacklustre shine.

The Nuts following obligation was on Saturday 22nd March 1924, when the near one hundred and fifty miles round trip to York Street, Boston to meet Lincolnshire rival, Stumpy, the mascot named after the famous Boston Stump Church of St Botolph. At least in this instance, the Scunthorpe United men had had seven days to rest, since their ninety minutes of toil, against Wombwell, allowing some recovery time to heal injuries. Therefore, the Scunthorpe United Club fielded the following eleven: Reynolds, goalkeeper; Bradbury and Franklin, fullbacks; Skull, Ashmore and Millson, halfbacks; Kitchen, Broskom, Burkinshaw, Raby, and Foster, forwards.

The Nuts got off to an

free kick for hands at the Boston end caused excitement, but the defence managed after a struggle to get the ball away. The Stumpites were playing a better game now, despite the wind. When they attacked again Heil and Westwood strove hard, but could not penetrate the defence.

Scunthorpe broke away again, but the outside-left shot widely. Dickson was responsible for making a nice opening, but Heil was given offside. A corner accrued at the visiting end, but the ball

break-through. The visiting defence gave away a free kick, deep in their own half. From this a pin-point cross dropped on the toe of Boston's centre forward, named Bangay, and he smashed the ball into the Scunthorpe net. This point was cheered heartily by the followers of Stumpy, who was

a miserable one for the Scunthorpe party.

On the following Thursday, United travelled the two dozen miles up the road to play Doncaster Rovers at the new Belle Vue ground. Little has been discovered about this game, because a report did not appear in the local journal. However, it would seem that there were a number of injuries, leading to drastic Scunthorpe team changes.

A 4-0 loss was uncharacteristic of the team, even though the forward line was not the sharp pencil that supporters wished for. However, the loss of Burkinshaw was a blow, and the mid-field found Skull and Millson unable to attend.

At right half, Scunthorpe United played 'Hill' and it is possible this was Shem Hill, who may have come out of retirement for the one game, in an emergency.

encouraging start, and for the first ten minutes or so, made advances on the Boston goal, but could not find the finishing blow. Their finishing was weak, and never troublesome to the home custodian. Then Boston had their moments to attack the Scunthorpe target, and a shot all along the ground had to be pushed round the post by Reynolds. On about twenty minutes, Boston made a decisive

proving to be a stubborn fellow.

At half-time that one goal lead stilled prevailed, and try as they may, the Nuts could not penetrate the local back line. It was a poor display that was not good enough to cause any alarm to the home side's back quarters, where it mattered. Boston had inflicted on Scunthorpe exactly what they themselves had done to Rotherham and Wombwell. The trudge back to North Lincolnshire was

# OUR VISITORS TODAY

We take a look at this afternoon's opponents, first starting with their brief history of how they got to where they are today...



## A BRIEF HISTORY

**Banbury United's genesis is found in Spencer Villa, a work's club formed in 1931.**

Friendly matches were played on a ground on the town's Middleton Road. The club joined the Banbury Junior League for the 1933-34 season and won the Championship at their first attempt. They changed their name to Banbury Spencer in 1934 and moved to their current ground for the start of the 1934-35 season in which they competed in the Oxfordshire Senior League. They won this too at their first attempt, being elected to the Birmingham Combination league for the start of the following season.

After the war, Banbury resumed in the Birmingham Combination and turned professional for the 1946-47 season. A year later, with attendances averaging 3,500, they finished runners-up in the league and reached the First Round Proper of the FA Cup, losing 2-1 at Colchester United, at that time a Southern League Club.

In the next season, they broke the ground attendance record when 7,160 turned up to see Banbury lose to Oxford City in the third

qualifying round of the FA Cup. Banbury's manager at the time was Jimmy Cringan, who joined them in 1936 and was to remain the boss for 25 years until his retirement in 1961.

The Birmingham League became the West Midlands League in 1962, and the club would also become independent, with the Spencer company ending their association. In April 1965, a group of local businessmen bought the club and would rebrand as Banbury United.

United would embark on an unbroken 24-season run in the Southern League. It would be in 1990 when the side would be relegated for the first time in their history, moving to the Hellenic League. Those who expected a quick return would be disappointed, as it wouldn't be until 1999-00 when they'd clinch the title. They'd take a couple of years to find their feet back in the the Southern League Eastern Division.

The side would go through another decline in the years that followed, with relegation avoided in 2009 following a reprieve, while 2012 saw the side secure safety on the final day. Exodus and decline would follow when the inevitable

happened again, being relegated for only the second time in 2015.

Changes, though, were on their way, with the supporters club looking to take the club. The side regained their place in the Premier Division via the play-offs, beating Taunton Town in front of 1,200 spectators, the highest for more than 21 years.

Few would argue that 2021-22 was the best in the club's 90-year history, reaching the proper FA Cup rounds, losing to Barrow. With just two league defeats all season, they won the league by 23 points, reaching the National League North for the first time in their history.

Last season, they began well and were challenging for the play-offs before a poor run of form in March led to them ending just above the relegation zone, leading to a much-changed side this season.

Harding is an experienced 31-year-old goalkeeper who came through the Banbury United youth side. Harding spent a number of years away from the Puritans but returned to the club in the summer of 2015 and has now made over 300 appearances for Banbury.

A 21-year-old central defender who was in the junior set-up at Norwich City. Fleming later joined then National League Premier side King's Lynn Town for the start of season 2020/21, making 19 league appearances in his first season with them. Following fruitful loan spells he earned a move to Banbury this past summer.

#### **Louis Hall**

24-year-old left back who was with the academies at Aston Villa and Kidderminster Harriers before gaining experience with Stourbridge, Bromsgrove Sporting, and Bedford Town. After spending time with a number of tier six clubs he joined Banbury in August.

#### **Manny Maja**

*Age: 22*

*Nationality: Nigerian*

*Position: Midfielder*

The 22-year-old central midfielder who came through the Kinetic Academy in South London. He had spells with AFC Croydon and Welling United before joining Isthmian League Premier Division side Enfield Town for the 2021-22 season.

He won the Young Player of the Year award that season.

After a short stint with Tonbridge Angels at the start of the 2022-23, Maja moved to Cheshunt in October 2022, making 29 National League South appearances for the Ambers through to the end of last season. His performances over the course of that season earned him a move to Banbury in the summer.

The central midfielder has been a shining light in a difficult season for the Puritans, and will be one to watch this afternoon.



## Jack Tompkins

21-year-old full back or midfielder who came through the Barnet academy to earn a professional contract in December 2018. As well as making a handful of first team appearances for the Bees, Tompkins had a spell on loan with Staines Town before being released at the end of 2020-21 season. Joined Banbury in July 2023.

## Jack Davies

Davies is a 20-year-old central defender, a product of the MK Dons academy, progressing to earn his first professional deal with them in August 2020. He would go on to make five senior appearances for MK Dons, however opted to join the Puritans after expiration of his contract this past summer.

## Rudi Pache

Pache is a 21-year-old central defender who came through the Barnsley academy, going on to earn a professional deal with them in the summer of 2020. Highly rated at Barnsley he played for Esbjerg in Denmark in the 2021-22 season before recently spending time with Glossop North End.

## MIDFIELDERS

## Lawson D'Ath

The 30-year-old experienced central midfielder has a total of 161 Football League appearances to his credit, and signed for Banbury in the summer of 2023. After winning promotion with Northampton Town in 2014, moves to Luton Town and MK Dons followed before he returned to then National League side Yeovil for the 2019-20 season.

## Simeon Maye

Maye is a 28-year-old central midfielder who was with Birmingham City as a youngster. Spells with Rushall Olympic, Hereford and Brackley Town followed before he joined Leamington in the summer of 2020. Injuries meant that finding game time was limited from the start of the

calendar year so he left the club and joined Banbury in March 2023.

## Craig Hewitt

19-year-old attacking midfielder who joined the Coventry City academy as a 14-year-old, progressing to be taken on by them as a scholar in the summer of 2020, playing regularly for their U18 side. Hewitt joined Banbury originally in September 2022 and after a short spell away Re-signed for Banbury at start of this season.

## Harley Giles

Giles 22-year-old midfielder who came through the Oxford United academy. He played a key part in Didcot's promotion to the Premier Division through the play-offs at the end of the 2022-23 campaign before joining Banbury in December.

## FORWARDS

## Ken Charles

22-year-old striker who joined Banbury this past summer. His pyramid experienced performances earned him a move to then National League Premier side King's Lynn Town in November 2021 but he found game time limited with the

Norfolk club so transferred to the Puritans permanently in 2023.

## Ricky Johnson

An experienced 35-year-old striker who originally came through the Banbury youth side, Johnson made a handful first team appearances before going on to play for Easington Sports. Following a shock return in 2015 he continued to be prominent for the Puritans, however left the club at the end of season 2020-21, having made 278 appearances and having scored 97 goals across his three spells. He then went on to play for Evesham United and Easington Sports before returning to Banbury for a fourth spell in February 2024.

## Aidan Elliott-Wheeler

A promising 17-year-old winger who impressed whilst at Banbury on loan from Oxford United in the final few weeks of last season, making nine National League North appearances. Returned on loan from Oxford at the start of this season and has thrived from the flanks.

# LOAN WATCH...

*We take a look at the players away from the Attis Arena on loan...*

## FIN SHRIMPTON

Iron academy graduate and fan favourite midfielder Fin Shrimpton has been thriving in recent weeks in the National League North with a medley of consistent performances coming over the course of his current loan spell with now play-off hopefuls Spennymoor Town.

Shrimpton linked up with former Marske United manager Graeme Lee in mid-February in search of valuable game time that he'd found hard to come by in the weeks leading up to his departure. So far while being at Brewery Field, Shrimpton has featured in all seven fixtures and has fast become the heart to the Moors midfield and has been instrumental in his sides recent surge up the league standings.

Firstly, Shrimpton has been a used substitute on two separate occasions the first of which being his debut in black and white against Blyth Spartans a game in which Shrimpton helped his side coast to a comfortable 2-0 victory. The other substitute appearances were to be his sides 2-1 victory over play-off challenger Boston United.

Elsewhere, the workhorse midfielder has played every available minute with his more notable performances coming in Spennymoor's 1-1 draw with a high-flying Chester side, a tightly contested affair in which Shrimpton popped up with a first-half equaliser that would go on to be crucial. Despite this by far Fin's best performance for the Moors came in their local derby with northerly neighbours Darlington. During the encounter Shrimpton's pinpoint cross to find the head of Will Harris would later earn him a well-deserved man of the match award.

## MARCUS CARVER

After joining the Iron ahead of the 2022-23 season, the striker made 20 appearances in claret and blue last campaign and since the last edition, he's been thoroughly enjoying his football at fellow National League North outfit and initial strugglers Southport.

In recent months Carver has regained his place in Southport manager Jim Bentley's starting XI and has more than repaid the faith instilled in him by Bentley especially in recent weeks. As of late Carver has been seen partnering fellow Iron loanee Richie Bennett at the front of the Sangrounders line and both the loanee's have been in fine goalscoring form.

Since Carver's previous loan watch mention the experienced striker has improved his goalscoring tally massively, combined with a number of valiant and match winning performances he's found consistent form which has seen him acquire 11 goals over the course of his spell.

Since a suspension that saw him miss his sides 3-0 defeat against Chorley in mid-February, Carver has gone on to play six consecutive 90 minutes. In these games Carver has notably combined with Bennett on several occasions and has scored three goals in that time.

## RICHE BENNETT

As previously mentioned, the experienced striker Bennett has been a forced to be reckoned with alongside Carver in recent weeks. The 33-year-old has obtained a total of five goals.

The majority of Bennett's goals have come of late as since early February he's managed to net

three strikes and has often been seen operating in a two-striker formation that has benefited not just his performances but his sides as well as they've proceeded to pull away from the relegation zone.

Bennett has thrived in helping the Sandgrounders obtain four wins from their last six games. His most notable performance came against Scunthorpe's promotion challengers Chester, as during the recent Tuesday's round of fixtures the striker aided his parent club's promotion quest by netting a towering header in the latter stages of the game to earn his side a 1-0 victory.

## ROSS BARROWS

**The versatile right-back returned to his former club King's Lynn Town on an initial one-month loan two weeks ago.**

Having spent the campaigns opening stages on loan at Northern Premier League side Ilkeston Town, Barrows joins the Walks with hopes of playing more games as he aims to help Lynn in their quest to survive relegation as the season draws to a close.

So far since his return, Barrows has made the one senior appearance back in blue and gold as he was introduced reintroduced to the fans as he came on as a substitute in the 86th minute during his sides 1-0 victory over Blyth Spartans.

## JOSH ROBERTSON

Following Marske's withdrawal, Robertson's next move was to head back out on loan to his local side Northallerton Town. Unfortunately, Robertson was unable to register an appearance for the Ally as he sustained a lengthy injury in training prior to his debut.

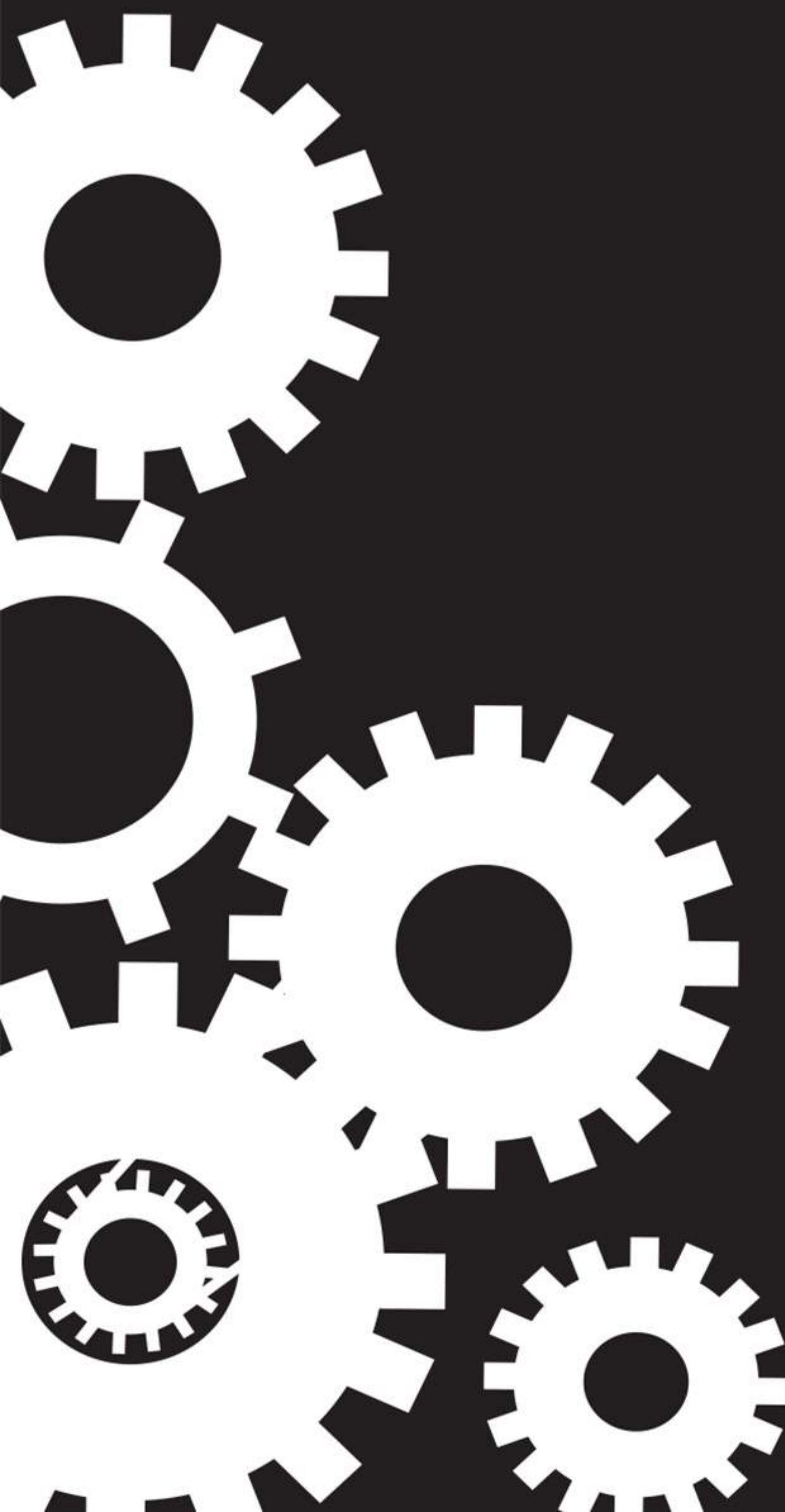

# ON THE ROAD WARRINGTON TOWN



**SATURDAY, MARCH 23RD - 3PM**

The Iron are set to travel to face Warrington Town in their latest Vanarama National League North encounter on the road.

As has been normal procedure throughout the season, the trip to Cantilever Park will be the side's first encounter at the ground, and comes following the 1-0 reverse fixture win at the Attis Arena earlier in the season.

## THE STADIUM

The club has played at the 2,500 capacity ground since 1965, and it was the venue for the finest hour in the club's history – the FA Cup first round win over League Two side in Exeter in November 2014.

It sits on the northern bank on the Manchester Ship Canal in Latchford. It takes its name from the Cantilever Bridge, a high-level road bridge on Ackers Road over the Manchester Ship Canal that towers over the ground to the east. The ground consists of three stands, two of which is seated, with a brand new stand for away fans which is in progress and is set to be completed around the time of

our visit. This was made possible after the club received final confirmation of the required monies from the Premier League Stadium Fund, which covers up to 60% of the costs. Due to the terms of the application, none of the work that formed part of the funding application could be started in advance of this.

## BY CAR

A 102-mile drive from the Attis Arena, Cantilever Park is an estimated two hours and 30 minutes away when travelling by car.

> Take Doncaster Rd/A18 to A1077 (M)

> Take M180, M18 and M1, heading to A616 in Tankersley. Take Junction 35A from M1

> Follow A616 and A628 to M67 in Mottram in Longdendale

> Take M60 and M56 (take exit 9) to A50

> Continue on A50, drive to Common Lane in Warrington

## CAR PARKING

There are limited spaces available on the Club Car Park

on matchdays, however it is advised you arrive early to guarantee a space. There is road parking available around the ground.

## ALTERNATIVE TRAVEL

Unfortunately, the ground's location isn't great. The ground is easily missed as you go round the corner of Loushers Lane. It's a couple of miles from the town's bus and rail stations, although you can get a bus from the town centre to the ground.

The closest station to the ground is Warrington Bank Quay and is 1.7 miles away.

You get to the ground through a small car park, and there are then three turnstiles tucked away to the right hand corner of the ground.

## FACILITIES

The club house holds the changing rooms, an office and a hospitality lounge, while there is also a social club attached to the ground.

Down that side there is also a club shop and a small refreshments hut.

**The Iron will be back at the Attis Arena on Good Friday, as the side welcome King's Lynn Town.**

One of the full-time outfits in the league, the Linnets have been flirting with relegation all season, and currently sit in 19th place with 43 points from 37 games played, as many as two games in hand over a couple of teams around them, but with Darlington poised to overtake them following their massive upturn in form.

Despite this danger, Lynn have given themselves chance of pulling away from the drop also with two wins in a row, first heading up a 3-1 home win over South Shields before backing it up with a 1-0 victory on the road at Blyth Spartans. The side would have faced Bishop's Cleeve in midweek, but for a waterlogged pitch.

The Linnets are actually unbeaten in six games, with just one defeat in nine, as the relegation picture has continued to change in the last couple of weeks. Their away form has been key to this, picking up three wins and a draw in their last four fixtures, beating Gloucester City and Brackley on the road, while picking up a point at high-flying Alfreton Town.

The reverse fixture at the Walks back in November ended in a disappointing defeat for the Iron, with the home side winning 3-1 in a result that was not in keeping with United's form.
